Context

The aim of the Summer School programme is to deliver a short summer school with a blend of academic education and enrichment activities.

Students completed a full recovery curriculum centred around daily: literacy, numeracy, science, PE and geography lessons. This allowed all teaching groups to be introduced to the Lord's Hill way and Oasis ethos. Lessons were planned and centred following the English and Maths Mastery and OCL curriculum. The curriculum plan for the week directly addressed specific areas of significant recovery from KS2.

Students completed PE daily including trampolining, basketball, football and badminton. Our final celebration day included a sports day which all students embraced and fully enjoyed. Throughout the week Showcase Instrumental provided clarinet and guitar instrumental lessons alongside singing classes. In fitting with the Euros students had the opportunity to explore the Italian culture and complete cooking workshops. Throughout the week the academy's pastoral team providing, 'wellbeing' sessions to support the transition process for our more anxious students.
