MACBETH:

Number	Scene	Quotation	Reveals
1	Act 1, Scene 2	"Like Valour's minion...till he unseamed him from the nave to the chaps" - Captain	+Macbeth is highly regarded for his violent streak against Duncan's traitor
2	Act 1, Scene 5	"Too full of the milk of human kindness" – Lady Macbeth	+Lady Macbeth sees her husband as a coward who needs to be manipulated
3	Act 2, Scene 1	"Is this a dagger I see before me? Come, let me clutch thee" - Macbeth	+Macbeth hallucinates and sees a bloody dagger on his way to Duncan's room to kill the King
4	Act 2, Scene 2	"All great Neptune's water" - Macbeth	+Macbeth is not sure that all the water in the oceans will clear the blood, and by proxy, guilt, from his hands
5	Act 4, Scene 2	"Mother, I am slain." – Macduff's son	+Macbeth hires murderers to kill Macduff's family
6	Act 4, Scene 3	"Angels are bright still, though the brightest [Lucifer] fell" - Malcolm	+Malcolm compares Macbeth to Lucifer, showing the idea that Macbeth has been corrupted
7	Act 5, Scene	"Life is but a walking shadow" - Macbeth	+Macbeth realises that both life and his power are ephemeral

Number	Chapter	Quotation	Reveals
1	1	"austere with himself..."	+Utterson's introduction as a respectable Victorian gentleman
2	1	"the man trampled calmly over the child's body and left her screaming on the ground. It sounds nothing to hear, but it was hellish to see" - Enfield	+Enfield shares the story of Hyde trampling an innocent girl
3	2	"he would see a room where his friend lay asleep, dreaming, and lo! there would stand by his side a figure to whom power was given, and even at that dead hour, he must rise and do its bidding." – Utterson's nightmare	+the impact Hyde has on Utterson
4	3	"Mr. Hyde was pale and dwarfish, he gave an impression of deformity without any nameable malformation"	+description of Hyde's appearance
5	4	"with ape-like fury, he was trampling his victim under foot and hailing down a storm of blows, under which the bones were audibly shattered and the body jumped upon the roadway. At the horror of these sights and sounds, the maid fainted"	+the murder of Sir Danvers Carew at the hands of Hyde
6	10	"I have been doomed to such an awful shipwreck: that man is not truly one, but truly two"	+Jekyll's conclusion about the duality of man
7	10	"served in me those provinces of good and ill which divide and compound man's dual nature"	+Jekyll's scary realisation that what is most troubling about his dual nature is that he has an equal amount of evil inside of him compared to the good
